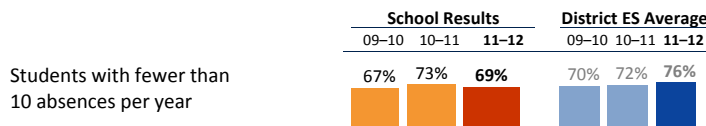

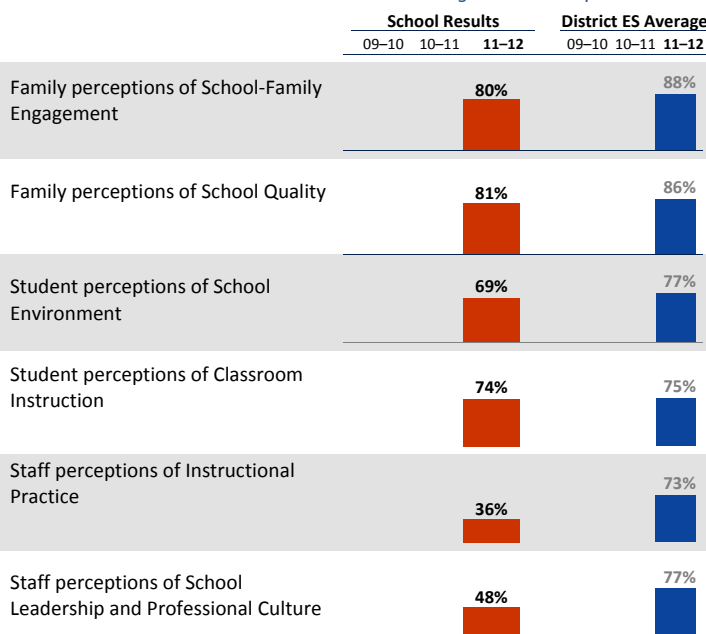

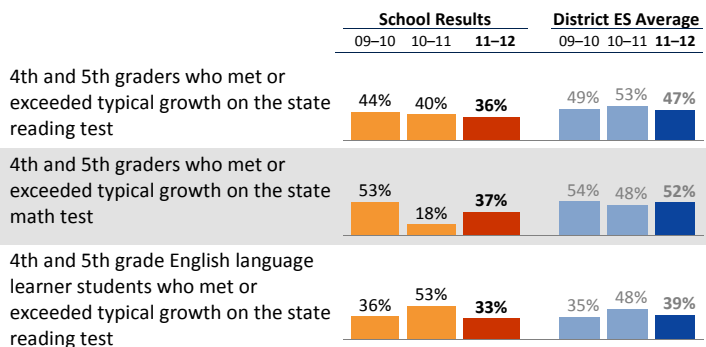
Average Positive Responses

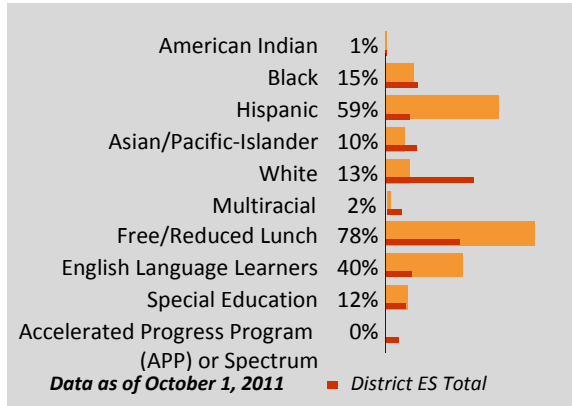

### Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students



This measure shows how much growth students have achieved compared to similar students across the state in the same grade level. ## School Plan & Budget for the 2012-2013 School Year

### School Mission Statement

The Mission of Concord International School is to provide our students with an academically rigorous education from a global perspective in a respectful and inclusive environment.

### School Goals

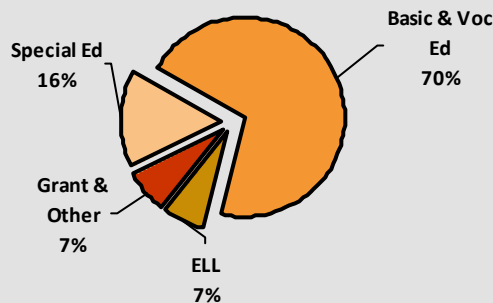
3rd grade: increase the % of students proficient on MSP math test from 58.2% to 68.2%, and from 56.4% to 66.4% for reading. 4th grade: increase the % of students proficient on the MSP math test from 54.9% to 64.9%, from 73.2% to 80% for reading, and from 73.2% to 75% for writing. 5th grade: increase the % of students proficient on the MSP math test from 38.9% to 60%, from 63.9% to 75% for reading, and from 52.8% to 60% for science.

### School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

**Reading:** Teachers met at the start of the year to examine academic data, review past practices, and develop specific intervention plans for students. Grade level teachers are meeting weekly to review classroom-based assessment. Staff who attended the math common core work in the summer will share the new standards with colleagues in order to align classroom instruction with these new standards. Each student receives 30 minutes of guided reading instruction in small groups, plus additional time in small groups for students not meeting standard. Grade 3, 4, and 5 students scoring level 1 or 2 on the MSP Reading Assessment receive additional reading instruction and support completing homework in extended schooling opportunities. Parents are provided opportunities to support their child in accessing leveled books. Parents are also provided information on how to interpret MAP and MSP data in reading and math. **Math:** A minimum of 60 minutes of math instruction during the school day. Students who did not meet MSP proficiency last year will be provided differentiated instruction and homework support during extended day.
