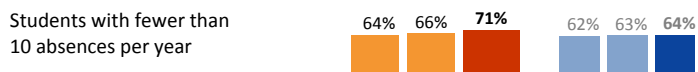
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

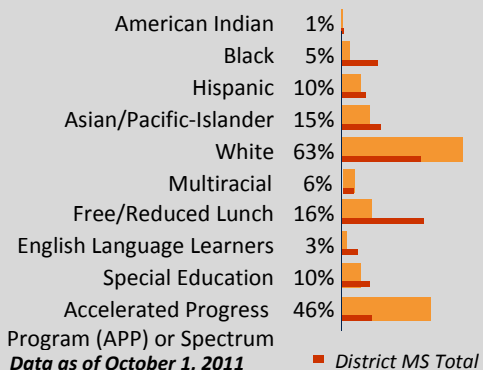

Student Demographics



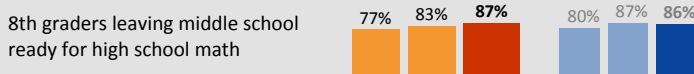
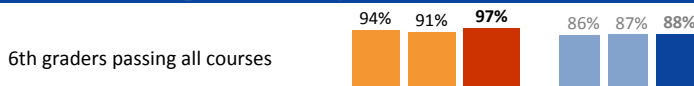

School Mission Statement

Hamilton International Middle School, a rigorous academic and collaborative learning community, educates students to succeed and contribute in a diverse world. At Hamilton International Middle School, we value Continuous growth, Respect, Diversity, Integ

School Goals

Math: We will increase the percentage of students proficient on the state MSP Math assessment: 6th grade – from 91% to 93%; 7th grade – from 82.3% to 86%; 8th grade – from 76.7% to 81%. **Reading:** We will increase the percentage of students proficient on the state MSP Reading assessment: 6th grade – from 91% - 93%; 7th grade – from 90.3% to 93%; 8th grade – from 76.7% to 81%. **Writing:** We will increase the percentage of 7th grade student proficient on the state MSP Writing assessment form 85.6% to 90%.

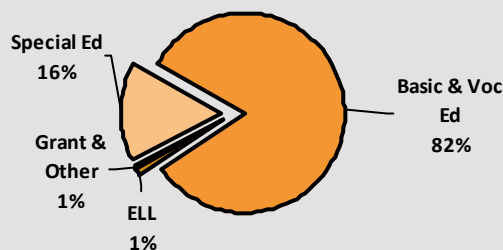
School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

Math: We have implemented a co-teaching model in math classes for targeted students currently not meeting standard on the MSP. Teachers are working collaboratively to provide math interventions during the school day. Additionally, teachers are developing common assessments and transitioning to standards based grading in order to better support student progress and provide students with multiple opportunities to demonstrate proficiency.

Reading & Writing: We have implemented a co-teaching model in many Language Arts classes to support struggling learners. Teachers are collaboratively aligning the curriculum to the Common Core State Standards and developing common formative assessments. Teachers continue to use the Reader’s and Writer’s Workshop model in classes and are participating in professional development with a coach from Teacher’s College during the school year.
