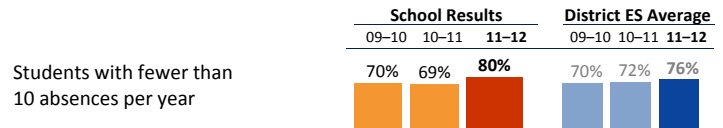

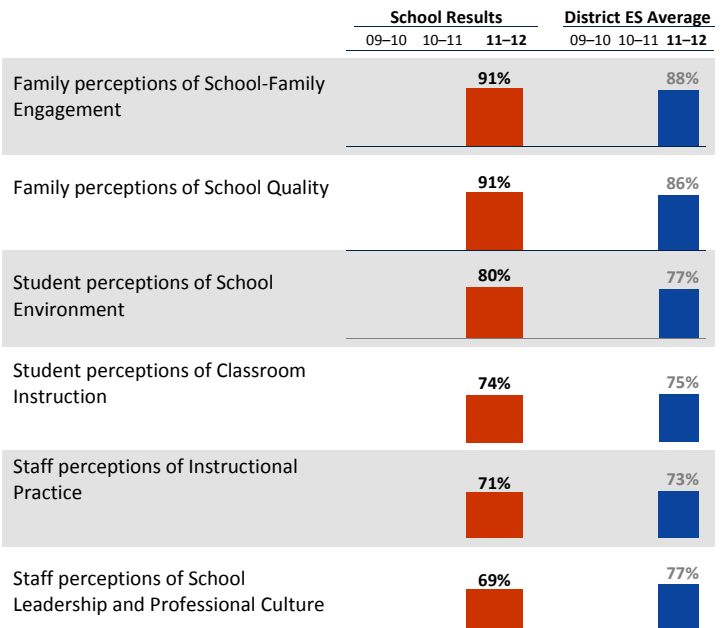

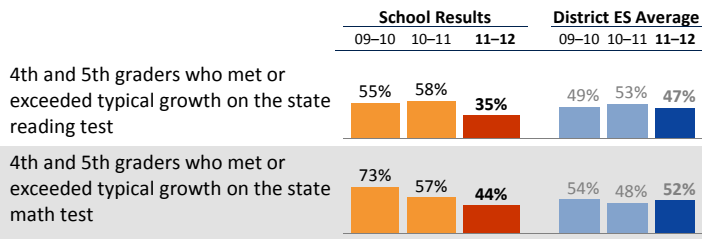
Average Positive Responses

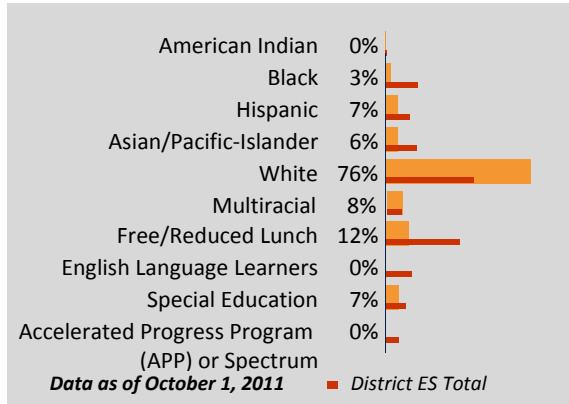
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

Schmitz Park is an inclusive school where every child can grow with curiosity, confidence and broad competence. Each and every Schmitz Park student is taught to learn without limit, independently and collaboratively.

School Goals

Our school goals this year are dedicated to 1) extending our strong school-wide community traditions to ensuring strong grade-level cohort connections, and 2) establishing strong curriculum alignment across the six grades so that student learning builds logically from year to year. While state test scores make comparison of cohorts year-to-year difficult, we will know we are on track when 1) in math, 90 percent of continuously enrolled students in the tested grades (3-5) score proficient on the state test (MSP), and 2) in writing, 80 percent of fourth grade students score proficient on the state writing test (MSP) and school-wide writing assessments.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

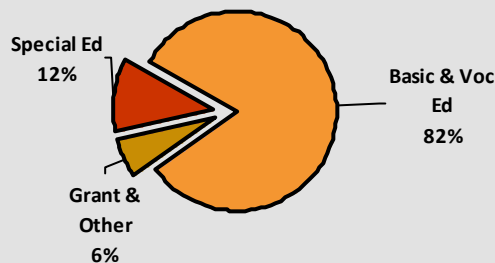
For 2012-13, our school is focused on sustaining the strong growth that we see in students at all levels of performance while managing the substantial increase of our student body (over 70% since 2009).

In math: our “walk-to-math” program made possible by a math specialist working with grades 3-5 ensures flexible, small groupings and differentiated instruction to support our highly successful Singapore Math program. Additional schoolwide elements of our math instruction include mental math, bar-model problem solving strategies, math fact mastery and mathematical dialogue. In writing: teachers at all grade levels will implement Writers Workshop Units of Study to align with the Common Core State Standards. Our balanced literacy program will continue to develop Readers Workshop as a guiding framework to ensure that instruction of reading skills is targeted to the developmental needs of students so they can stay on pace with Common Core standards.

As a school with a strong tradition of meeting the needs of all learners, opportunities for advanced learners are integrated throughout the curriculum through intentional planning by our highly skilled teachers. At all grades, “Challenge” activities are encouraged, and individualized writing and leveled reading instruction (workshop) is used. Also, “walk-to-math” leveled instruction is in place for grades 3-5; most Singapore Math curriculum is a year ahead of state standards, and most of our graduates qualify for advanced math instruction in middle school.
